## Notes

Please refer to the following information to prepare for the camp.

### **(1) Workshop**

Students of each university will form a group to prepare for the presentation on the topic of their choice and will need to have one speaker to deliver their reports. Three sessions of the workshop are as follows:

- (1) Facing the Challenge of Trust between Asian Countries
- (2) Going Global, Beyond the Invisible Barrier
- (3) Sustaining the Globe, in Search of Asian Collaboration

All groups will have 30 minutes for presentation including 10 minutes of Q&A.

During the discussion session on the following day of the workshop, all speakers will be invited to the panel discussion. Other participants are also encouraged to give opinions and arguments as the speakers conclude the session.

### **(2) Culture Night**

This program is designed to introduce different cultures of regions in Northeastern Asia to all students of the camp and to help them understand the difference as well as the similarity between the regions.

During 30 minutes of regional introduction, students from the same region will cooperate together to present their unique cultures and heritages that they would like to promote to other students in their own creative way.

### **(3) T. O. P**

This is an outdoor game that students will move from a station to a station in a group. Different stages of the game will be placed throughout the university campus and all students will have an opportunity to explore the campus more closely.

More detailed instructions of the game will be provided to all players during the camp in August.

#### **(4) Farewell Party**

Students are advised to bring a formal dress or suit that is appropriate for this closing party. Male students do not need to wear jackets but it is recommended that they bring shirts to the camp for this formal event.
